

PLU 11th Annual Middle and High School Programming Contest February 2023 Contest Results

The Eleventh Annual Pacific Lutheran University Middle and High School Programming Contest was held Saturday, February 11st, at the Morken Center for Learning and Technology.

Advanced Category:

Novice Category:

3rd Place – Auburn Riverside – Team: GG Band
(8 problems in 542 minutes)

All the winning teams received engraved medals and the top team in the advanced category won a perpetual trophy that is engraved with their names and the name of their high school. The winning team will retain the trophy until September to be displayed at their high school.
